

SOUTH TRUMPINGTON PARISH MEETING

Minutes of the Meeting of the Parish Meeting held by Zoom on Thursday 21st January 2021 at 7pm

3.1 District Councillors Report

Cllr Sollom's written report was noted. The COVID-19 vaccination rollout is taking place and ramping up quickly, it is expected that GP surgeries will be providing more vaccinations in the coming weeks and months. Greater Cambridge Shared Planning are currently seeking feedback, by an online survey, to help narrow down the proposed sites.

1 Greater Cambridge Local Plan –Call for Sites

James Cochrane from Grosvenor gave a presentation on the initial proposals for the site between Trumpington Meadows and the M11. The proposals include up to 750 zero-carbon homes, with 40% being affordable homes, and up to 23 hectares of country park.

The meeting agreed that the country park element looked good but noise from the M11 would be a major concern for the usability and practicality of the country park and the proposed houses and that noise mitigation would need to be significantly improved. It was also noted that there was likely to be a bottleneck on the proposed P&R access road through the site due to it only being single lane. Concerns were raised about the road network coping with an additional 750 homes worth of vehicles, especially at peak times. Play areas and equipment are still being considered by the developer.

3.3 Update on Trumpington Meadows Delivery and Action Group (TM DAG)

P Colbert spoke to his written report. The Christmas event took place and was a success, the event was featured 2 weeks running in the Cambridge Independent. The food vans at the Local Centre have been a success, no additional litter has been generated as a result of them being there. A new group is being set up to take forward issues with inferior build quality in buildings in the development.

3.4 Update from Trumpington Residents Association (TRA)

The report from the TRA was noted. The Clay Farm Centre is being used as a vaccination centre, it is currently very busy and is a good use of the centre. The Trumpington Pavilion is currently acting as a food hub on Fridays. Concerns were raised about the Grosvenor proposals and the suitability of the location. The proposals for the P&R site still have significant issues with the access which need addressing.

3.4 Update from Trumpington Meadows Community

It was reported that the group is still operating. Concerns about the location of the proposed Grosvenor primary school were raised, the proposed site is very boggy.

4 M11 Noise Attenuation Update

Quotes for noise surveys have been received. It was agreed to accept the quote from MAS Environmental for £1600 – £2138.

It was noted that the responses received from the Highways Agency were disappointing as they are not concerned about outdoor noise levels, only indoor.

5 East-West Rail and Cambridge Approaches Group

There is a meeting with the local MP, Anthony Browne, in February. It was noted that there was some talk of a northern rail route being discussed but nothing official had been put forward. It was agreed that James Randall would attend the meeting.

6 Defibrillator Update

It was noted that the Defibrillator has been delivered to Sainsbury's and installation is expected shortly following final approval by Sainsbury's Facilities Department.
