As we reported in October, the TRA has been concerned for some time about our continued management of Trumpington Pavilion, which we took on from the City Council in October 2009. We are continuing with the current arrangements until the end of March and are then passing the management of the Pavilion back to the City Council and the Pavilion will be run as a branch of the Clay Farm Centre.

### **Trumpington Food Hub**

We continue to operate the Food Hub in Trumpington Pavilion from 12 noon to 1:30 pm on Fridays. Smita Botre has taken over as the Coordinator and will be very pleased to hear from you if you are interested in volunteering and with offers of food supplies, email: [foodhub@trumpingtonresidentsassociation.org](mailto:foodhub@trumpingtonresidentsassociation.org). The Residents' Association is also unable to continue to administer the Food Hub from the end of March but we are very much hoping that Cambridge City Foodbank will take it over and continue to run it from the Pavilion, at least for an initial period while they develop longer-term plans. They aim to move to a social supermarket model, part of a Cambridge-wide development. We should have confirmation of this and more details in a few weeks. The Cambridge City Foodbank team are looking forward to having your continued support from April.
